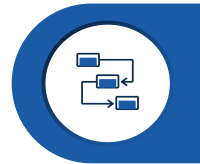

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# Deep-dive: Census Block Groups (CBGs)

## Key differences between census block groups and census blocks

|             | Census Block Group                                 | Census Block             |
|-------------|--|--------------------------|
| Description | 12-digit ID  | 15-digit ID              |
| Example     | 05023480502 <u>3</u>                               | 05023480502 <u>3</u> 059 |
| Count in AR | 2,294 (1,428 have BEAD eligible locations in them) | 180K+                    |



A **block group** consists of clusters of blocks within the same census tract that have the same first digit of their four-digit census block number

For example, blocks 3001 - 3999 belong to Block Group 3 for a particular census tract

CBGs will be the basic geographic unit used by applicants to draw their project area maps

## Recall | There are four key rules to follow when designing a project area composed of Census Block Groups



Design the project area using the following **project area rules**

- 1 **CBGs as building blocks:** Project areas are comprised of one or more CBGs, and bids must include all eligible locations within a selected CBG.
- 2 **CBG limitations:** An applicant may include the same CBG in a maximum of three bids in Tranche-1.
- 3 **Contiguity:** Project areas must be contiguous (sharing any amount of border, including a single point or corner).
- 4 **Contained CBGs:** When a CBG sits within the boundaries of another CBG, the applicant must include both CBGs in its project area if bidding for either.

| Question   | Answer  |
|--|---|
| <p><b>When is Tranche-1 opening?</b></p>   | <p>The target date is mid-October. However, this is dependent on approval of IPvII by NTIA. Once approved, ARConnect will publish an updated timeline, which will indicate the opening date of Tranche-1.</p>   |
| <p><b>When will project financials be required (project cost and budget information, match commitments, etc.)?</b></p> | <p>After the applicant is selected provisionally, at which time the applicant would prepare to share the project's financials (including the benefits of the BEAD subaward) with ARConnect.</p>   |
| <p><b>How will Reference Prices change between Tranche-1 and Tranche-2?</b></p>  | <p>After Tranche-1, ARConnect will know where ISP interest and competition is lacking, as well as how much funding will be required to make the awards to the applicants who were selected in Tranche-1. Then, ARConnect will <b>assess the opportunity to increase the Reference Prices after Tranche-1</b> in the areas which lack competition (i.e., Zero-Bid CBGs).</p>   |
| <p><b>Do Reference Prices limit the allowable Requested Subsidy?</b></p>   | <p>No, applicants may request any amount of funding they deem necessary for their project area and business case.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To be selected in Tranche-1 for award, you must request below the Reference Price.</li> <li>• To be considered for award in Tranche-2, you must request below twice the Reference Price.</li> <li>• In negotiations, ARConnect could make selections above 2x the Reference Price .</li> </ul> |
| <p><b>How is an applicant scored on workforce support?</b></p>   | <p>Applicants will have the opportunity to answer questions and demonstrate their workforce support plans and initiatives in the applicant portal. Applicants can refer to the Scoring Rubric (3.1) to see examples of workforce support initiatives that can earn points.</p>  |
| <p><b>How does the scoring work for criteria 1.1 BEAD Minimization Outlay and 1.2 Affordability?</b></p>               | <p><i>See detailed slides after this page</i></p>   |

# Backup | Minimization of BEAD Program Outlay Scoring Scale

## Scoring Scale Description

A **maximum of 40 points** are available from the Minimization of BEAD Program Outlay criteria

The score will be assessed based on how high or low an applicant's requested subsidy is relative to the reference price for the CBGs within the applicant's project area

A bid that **does not request a subsidy** will receive **40** points

A bid that **requests twice the reference price (or more)** for its project area will receive **0** points

A bid that **requests a subsidy exactly the same as the reference price** for its project area will receive **20** points

**1 point corresponds to a 5%** variation from the reference price



## Assuming a Reference Price of \$100K

| Requested Subsidy   | % of Reference Price | Points    |
|---------------------|----------------------|-----------|
| ↑                   |                      | ↓         |
| \$110,000.00        | 110%                 | 18 (-2)   |
| \$105,000.00        | 105%                 | 19 (-1)   |
| <b>\$100,000.00</b> | <b>100%</b>          | <b>20</b> |
| \$95,000.00         | 95%                  | 21 (+1)   |
| \$90,000.00         | 90%                  | 22 (+2)   |
| ↓                   |                      | ↑         |

# Backup | Affordability Scoring Scale

## Scoring Scale Description

A **maximum of 25 points** are available from the Affordability criteria

The score will be assessed based on how high or low their commitments are relative to the below baseline prices for the relevant tier of service:

- **Priority** bids (1/1 Gbps service): **\$85** per month
- **Non-priority** bids (100/20 Mbps): **\$37** per month

A bid that commits to plans **50% lower than the baseline price** will receive **25** points

A bid that commits to plans **50% higher than the baseline price** will receive **0** points

A bid that commits to plans **exactly the same as the baseline price** will receive **12.5** points

**0.5 points corresponds to a 2%** variation from the baseline price



## Assuming a Priority Bid

| Committed Price | % of Baseline Price | Points      |
|-----------------|---------------------|-------------|
| ↑               |                     | ↓           |
| \$88.40         | 104%                | 11.5 (-1.0) |
| \$86.70         | 102%                | 12 (-0.5)   |
| <b>\$85.00</b>  | <b>100%</b>         | <b>12.5</b> |
| \$83.30         | 98%                 | 13 (+0.5)   |
| \$81.60         | 96%                 | 13.5 (+1.0) |

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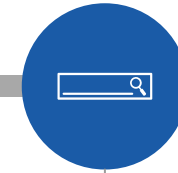
# Next steps

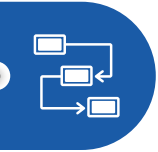
